## Course Outline

- 1. Drawing from observation (without erasers, without looking, upside down, gesture drawing, negative space, shading / highlights, etc)
- 2. Origami (basics, simple to intermediate, modulars, and a box to take things home in; time permitting, a complicated dragon model)
- 3. Interactive and pop-up cards (a mix of folding, gluing, cutting, and drawing)
- 4. Colour theory (wheel, mixing paints, understanding shade / tint, colour harmony, CMYK vs RGB, creating a canvas using what we've talked about)
- 5. Creating an accordion book + watercolour basics
- 6. Illustrating your imagination, character design using elements from nature with different hardnesses of pencils, coloured pencils, watercolours.
- 7. Automata animated machines with control mechanisms, featuring figures using cardboard, dowels, hot glue, paper, wire.
- 8. Polymer clay + wire basics, mixing colours, effects, making 'canes' to create tiles, jewelry & keychains, wrapping polymer gems.
